GENERAL OPERATING SAFETY TIPS

Operating Safety Tips

1. Refer to NOTICE label for Highest Standing Level, Working Load, and contact information.
2. Select ladder size to reach work without climbing above Highest Standing Level or over reaching.
3. Weight of user, tools, and materials shall not exceed Working Load.
4. Keep your hands and loose clothing away from the moving parts of the ladder.
5. To avoid pinching, keep clothing and body parts out and away of all moving mechanisms.
6. Keep all ladder steps, ladder feet, and other standing and gripping surfaces clean and free from foreign materials.
7. For your safety, never exceed the weight limit.
8. Do not use the ladder without spreader bars fully engaged.
9. Read all labels on the ladder before use. Replace labels if damaged or worn.

General Ladder Safety Tips

1. Select the correct ladder for your job—a ladder that is both rated for your weight and designed for the appropriate height and type of work you're doing.
2. Do a basic safety check before you get on any ladder. Look it over and make sure that rivets and welds are tight and in good condition, that the rails are in place, and that the ladder doesn't wobble. Check the feet of the ladder to make sure there's no build up of dirt, oil, or other material that would create an uneven surface.
3. Face forward and climb one step at a time while going up or down a ladder.
4. Do not stand on the top cap or the next step down.
5. When on a ladder, don't lean or reach too far to one side. A good rule of thumb is to always keep your belt buckle between the side rails. It's better to be safe and come down from the ladder and move it closer to your desired work area than to reach out too far and cause the ladder to fall.
6. Warning: Metal conducts electricity. Never let ladders of any material come in contact with live electrical circuits.
8. Never spend long periods on a ladder without regular breaks.
9. Inspect the ladder before each use. Never climb a damaged, bent or broken ladder.

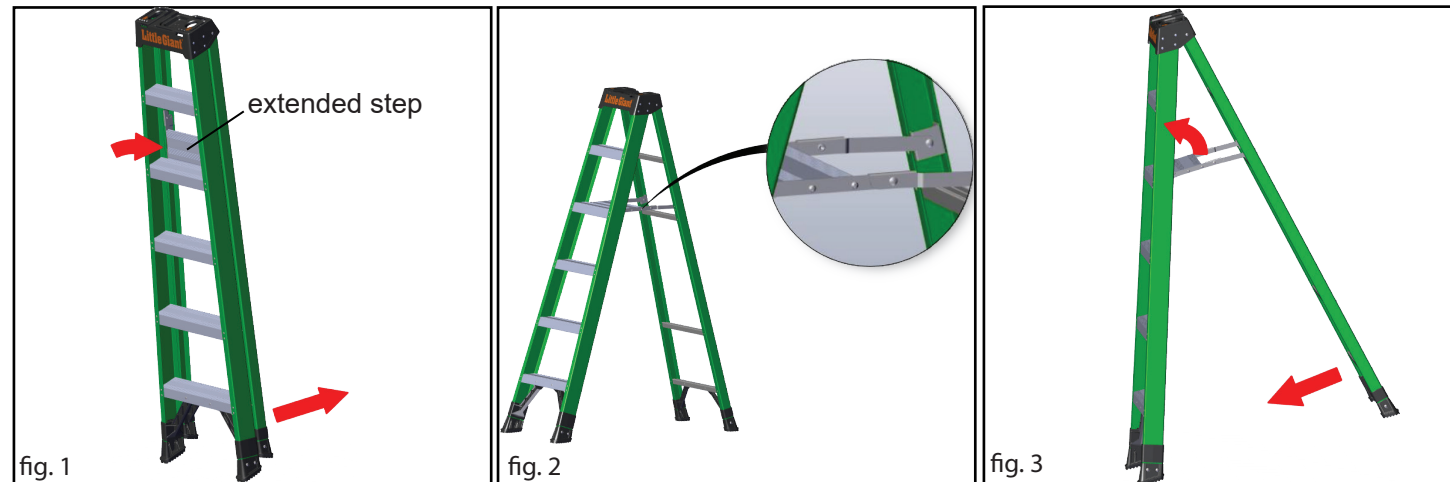

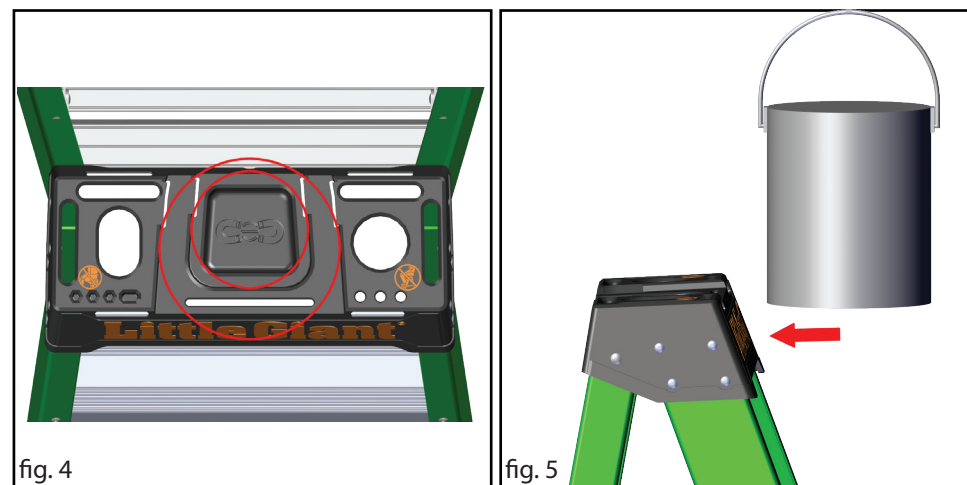
A-FORCE™

How To: Set Up & Close



1. To open, tip the ladder on its front legs and push down on the extended step. (fig. 1)
2. Make sure the spreader bars are fully engaged before climbing ladder. (fig. 2)
3. To close, tip the ladder on its front legs and pull the extended step toward you. Take care to not pinch your hands or fingers while closing. (fig.3)

How To: Use Paint Can Wedge Locks



1. Locate the paint can wedge locks located on the top cap. They can securely hold either a one gallon or a one quart can. (fig. 4)
2. Slide in the paint can from the front side toward the back until secure. (fig. 5)
3. To remove, reverse previous step. Make sure to keep the steps clean of any debris as to not make the surfaces slippery while using the ladder.

The top cap of the A-Force™ enables you to do a variety of jobs with many features, including:

- Various round holes for screwdrivers, hammers, drills, etc.
- Slotted holes for putty knives, drywall saws, etc.
- Magnetic dished area for nails, screws, nuts, bolts, etc.
- Paint can wedge locks can securely hold either a gallon or a quart paint can.
- Use along side other Little Giant favorites such as the Strap Holder™ and Loot Box™ accessories.*
